GREAT BROMLEY & DISTRICT CRICKET CLUB

The weather has certainly disrupted the start of the season. To play cricket you need a dry day (sunny and warm is most preferable but not necessary) and a playable pitch. The amount of rain has taken its toll and at the time of writing all 3 Sunday XI games have been cancelled, along with both midweek T20 games cancelled. The Club is trying to rearrange the colt fixtures that have had to be cancelled as they have so few games there is more chance and flexibility to do so later in the season.

The Saturday XI team have been a little more fortunate, as three out of four games have gone ahead. Holmwood House kindly allowed the use of their pitch (for which we are truly appreciative and thankful as the Bromley outfield was far too wet) We welcomed Walsham le Willows for the first game of a new season in Division 3 following last years promotion. Bobble hats, scarves and handwarmers were the order of the day along with thick cricket jumpers once on the field of play.

Bromley were put in to bat and managed 208 runs all out with the first 50 of the season coming from Adam Cuthbert. 3 wickets a piece from Michael Griffin, Ankush Jagota, James Bees and 1 run out saw Bromley with 2 balls to spare bowl out the opposition and claim 20 points. Just the start you need. Sadly one week later the rain fell, the covers leaked and Ipswich & ES were unable to provide a playable pitch. 6 points each for a cancelled match. Lakenheath away on Saturday 4th May and with Ed Fairley (captain) winning the toss put Lakenheath into bat. 195/7 off 45 overs. Ed Fairley taking 4

wickets and Ankush Jagota taking 3. A very tight game James Bees scoring 40 Ed Fairley 39 and Jack Jenno 26 and a much need partnership at the end from Codie Simpson and Ankush Jagota got Bromley over the line (196/8) and 18 points.



Saturday 11th saw a local derby against Elmstead Market. Our pitch was playable and a big thank you to Pip and Tom for working to get it so. The sun shone, the game had umpires and cricket tea was waiting for the players at half time. The new boundary rope after some struggles was put in place and the new electronic score board had its first use.

Captain Ed Fairley lost the toss and Bromley were asked to bowl. Ed took a wicket on the first ball of the first over and finished his spell with 3 wickets for 22 runs Ankush Jagota took 2 wickets along with Jack Jenno and Codie Simpson took 1 and 2 were run out with some great fielding by James Bees and James Blacker. Elmstead all out for 122. Bromley did not have it all their own way and a flurry of wickets taking us to 9-3 ensured that it was time for a couple of players to dig deep. Adam Cuthbert and Ed Fairley took the tally to 79-5 needing 55 to win. Codie Simpson confidently strode out having seen Bromley in a similar position the previous outing confidently took the dame to Elmstead and saw us over the line. Another win, another 20 points and currently sitting second in the table 1 point below Long Melford. Early days but its nice to see the momentum from last season continue so far.

Contact Details

Please remember if you change your address, contact number or email address that you contact the Surgery and let us know. It is extremely important that we hold up-to-date details for you to ensure we are able to contact you. It is very easy to update these details by going onto the Great Bentley Surgery website and searching for 'Change Personal Details'. By clicking on this it will allow you to complete a form with your new details which can then be submitted via the website. Once the form is received at the Surgery we will ensure your records are updated.

Patient Consent

We often have friends or family members contacting us about a patient. Due to patient confidentiality, we are not able to discuss their details with anyone else unless we have express written consent from the patient to do this. This includes even just confirming an appointment time or date. Our staff often experience dissatisfied patients as a result, but they would be breaking the law if they complied and have no option but to refuse their request.

If there is frequently a need to discuss someone else's details and they are happy for us to do this, they just need to write to us expressing consent to talk to the named person. In order to try and make this as easy as possible, we have a form that can be collected from reception for the patient to complete, giving consent for someone to speak to us on their behalf. Once this has been completed and returned to the Surgery it will be noted on the patient's record.

Missed Appointments

We have noticed a significant increase in the number of patients who are not attending their appointments and who have not contacted the Surgery to let us know they will be unable to attend. In March we had 170 missed appointments and in April 161 missed appointments.

We are aware that the demand for patient appointments is increasing and by cancelling an appointment you are not able to attend, it will ensure it is used by another patient and not wasted.

Please help us by ensuring that if you are not able to attend your booked appointment that you contact the Surgery on telephone number 01206 250691 to cancel this.

Along with all other surgeries in the area we will be shut from 12 noon on Thursday, 27June 2024 for staff training. If patients require urgent medical care on this afternoon, then this is available by contacting 111 for assistance.

Also at the Cross Inn is a Bleed Kit. The kit, provided by Great Bromley Parish Council, contains specialist equipment to help stem extreme blood loss before ambulance crews arrive.

Bleed control kits, also known as emergency trauma packs, are similar to first aid kits but include trauma dressings, gauze, chest seals and tourniquets to help stop serious bleeding. They can help victims of violent crime, those involved in road traffic accidents or workplace accidents, and could be particularly useful in rural areas where ambulance response times may be slower.

Essex Highways carry out regular inspections of roads and pavements, but issues may come up between these inspections. These could be potholes or other road surface issues, damaged street lights, street signs, overgrown trees, or issues with public rights of way.

We needed to repair a major section of the pub's roof at a cost of £26.000. This took a big chunk of our profits but we topped it up with fund raising.

we at The Mindful Life Counselling Group Charity are delighted to

have received funding from the Essex Community Foundation to provide free online mindfulness courses to support adults 65+ as well as older carers who may care for a family member or friend with a disability or illness.

We are hoping that this information could be circulated in a newsletter, ebulletin, face to face meetings etc. I have a small poster suitable for print and web if you think this might be helpful?

Background and information on the course:

The Mindful Life Group is offering online mindfulness courses that are fully funded

to support older adults in Essex. The course is led by a clinical psychologist who is also a mindfulness teacher.

The course is based on the mindfulness-based stress reduction course developed by John Kabat Zin but has been adapted for this population.

We have had really good feedback from participants, and we have found that it improves peoples' attention and memory, as well as reducing loneliness, low mood, stress, anxiety and chronic pain. Many participants have found it simply helps them deal with dayto-day stresses.

We currently have four courses beginning in June which involves one weekly meeting online for 1 -2 hours over 6 weeks with the option for participants to extend their practice with their group.

The course start dates and timings are as follows:

10th June 2024

Mindfulness for older adults who care (65+) Mondays -2-3pm

10th June 2024

Mindfulness for older adults who care (65+) Mondays -10-11am

12th June 2024

Mindfulness for over 65s Wednesdays- 12 -2pm

12th June 2024 Mindfulness for older adults who care (65+) Wednesdays - 11:30-12:30

RECTOR'S LETTER

Dear Friends

As the holiday season comes upon us, I wonder if it is the time when you take the opportunity to do a little reading. My wife Dawn is an avid reader and will have two or three books on the go at one time – a novel, an autobiography or some other non-fiction book. At a friend's house the other day we were both shocked to hear her say she may read up to seven books in a week! I am pleased to say I read three books whilst on holiday recently and (as I always think to myself) I must make more time to read especially when not on holiday.

Did you know the Bible is the bestselling book of all time? It is so consistently a good best-seller it is excluded from the popular Best-Sellers lists. I suspect there is a copy, somewhere, in most homes, even if a little dust covered. In the New Testament it says –

"All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right." (2 Timothy 3:16).

Many of our current laws, values and ethics have their origins in Christian teaching and although other faiths and teachings have similar themes, for Christians Jesus is the interpretive key. The bible is not just a history book, it has wisdom literature, worship songs (Psalms), letters of instruction and of course biography - the Gospels, giving us the Good News story of Jesus' life. Many of us would readily accept the fact that Julius Ceasar was a Roman Emperor. Yet, for example, there are only about 10 copies of 'Ceasar's Gallic War' written some 900 years after the events it recalls. The New Testament is based on some 20.000+ copies of manuscripts in various languages, the earliest estimated to be written just 30 years after the events it recalls. Many Christians, whether on holiday or not, try and read a passage from the Bible every day as a means of spiritual nourishment and guidance for their everyday living.

I hope this summer you will get a chance to have a break, whether just a change in the daily routines or a wonderful holiday away. And perhaps a good read will be part of this. I encourage you to consider making the bible at least a part of your holiday reading – Mark's Gospel could easily be read in one session. Enjoy your summer, enjoy your reading and enjoy getting to know Jesus through the bible. I pray you may know something of God's love and purpose for your life and find rest and recreation (that is re-creation) in whatever break you may have.
